### **MEAP TESTING**

Churchill third, fourth, and fifth grade students will take the MEAP test during the period of October 8-17. This is when the State Department of Education has designated schools to administer the annual MEAP test (final year). Third grade will be tested in math and reading, fourth grade will be tested in math, reading and writing, and fifth grade will be tested in math, reading, and science. It is important that students are in school these weeks and families avoid doctor/dentist appointments. Please help by ensuring that your child is well rested and eats a healthy diet. Results will be shared with parents once received by the school.

### **Parent Portal**

You can utilize parent portal to monitor your child's academic progress throughout the year. Please understand that in grades K-3 we assess students based on standards, which at times are at the end of a trimester. Due to this fact there might not be many assessments recorded on the parent portal site. Please contact your child's teacher if you have questions or concerns on their academic standing. Letters have been sent home for all new students and to the parent of students that have not yet accessed the portal.


