

Good evening parents, this is Vaughn White, Superintendent of Hesperia Community Schools with some information to share with you.

Parents, tomorrow, Friday, March 26 will be a half-day for students. Students will be released to go home in the afternoon.

Second, vaccines are available for adults and teens age 16 and over through our District 10 Health Department. If you wish to get a vaccine for yourself or your teen, go to the [DHD10.org](http://DHD10.org) website to register for an appointment. The spread of this virus is the highest right now in the teen and young adult population.

Spring break is coming up soon beginning on April 2. Many families will be getting together and/or traveling during this time. If you would like to be sure that you or your child has not picked up this virus during the spring break, antigen testing will take place on Sunday, April 11 at NCRESA in Fremont. Details regarding a specific time will be forth-coming.

Typically, one student testing positive in our school causes about 20-25 students to have to quarantine. So we appreciate it when your child is not feeling well that you keep them home and have them see the doctor. If there is someone in the home having Covid symptoms and/or awaiting a Covid test result, please keep your children home until you know that the test is negative. Following this guidance will help us keep students in school.

If you have any questions at all regarding whether you should keep your child home or not, side with keeping them home and contact the school or your doctor about the next steps. We are glad to answer your questions.
