On January 10, 2013 Hesperia Community Schools was announced as an Academic State Champion by Bridge Magazine. Hesperia Community Schools received a top 10 recognition in the $8^{\rm th}$ grade scores category.

Bridge Magazine adopted a new, value-added ranking system this year which measures a school's test scores adjusted for family income. Family income is often a predictor of a student's academic achievement and essentially, the Academic State Champions are being recognized by Bridge Magazine for over-achievement,

rather than achievement. Jeff Haase, Superintendent of Hesperia Community Schools, stated "We are extremely proud of our entire staff, students and parents. To achieve at such a high level requires a commitment by the entire school community."

"This year's Bridge Academic State Champions should all be immensely proud of this accomplishment," said John Bebow, President of The Center for Michigan, which publishes Bridge Magazine. "These schools – whether they are large or small, urban or rural, rich or poor – are leading the way to a better future in our state."

Superintendent's Message

It is hard to believe that we are half-way through the 2012-2013 school year! Although the months have passed quickly, much has been accomplished and Hesperia Community Schools was the recipient of several awards for outstanding academic achievement.

In the fall, both Hesperia Middle School and High School were designated as Reward Schools by the Michigan Department of Education. This designation is

given to schools that are closing achievement gaps in subgroups and making great progress in student achievement. Additionally, Hesperia Community Schools was named as an All State Academic Champion for 2012, one of only 50 districts in the state to receive this award. Bridge Magazine used an added-value scoring system when comparing standardized test scores for 4th, 8th and 11th grades with family income, as that is one indicator of student achievement.

These exceptional achievements would not be possible without the dedication and hard work of our students, families and the entire staff of Hesperia Community Schools. In addition, we are fortunate to be in a community that supports our schools.

The first half of the year has been a very successful one at Patricia St. Clair Elementary. Our students and staff have been hard at work with numerous lessons, projects, and field trips along with tons of learning and fun.

Some highlights from our first semester have been the Dome Theater visit, the 4th grade visiting the Capital in Lansing, our Halloween Parade, the Fire Safety Trailer and so many more. Every day is full of adventures from learning about

measurement to George Washington to the process of photosynthesis. Our students are active learners and are engaged while taking on new challenges every day.

Our Accelerated Reader Program is again very successful this year. Students, in grades 1^{st} - 4^{th} read books and then take comprehension tests, on the computer, over the book. They gain points, earn prizes and race around the track, as this year our theme is "Race into Reading". We already have had a few students make it all the way to the highest level. We have several who are close behind. Keep Reading!!!

We have two new online computer programs this year. Our students have additional support, remediation and challenges in both math and writing this year. Our new IXL math program is very successful. Our students can log on, earn points and have fun while practicing their

math facts at school and home. We also have a new online writing program, Write Source. This program is designed for students to set up an avatar and progress through the writing process while learning about grammar and writing structures. Both of these programs are used with students at school in the classrooms and computer labs as well as being accessible from home.



We had several students enter the Newaygo County Lion Heart Production coloring contest as a promotion for their recent production of The Wizard of Oz. They gave away 2 tickets to each winner, to see the show. Patricia St. Clair had three winners this year, from 3rd Grade Aria Thomas, 2nd Grade Jack Heminger and 1st Grade Sydney Hasted. Our Kindergarten Classes hosted a Kindergarten Thanksgiving Food Drive during the month of November in conjunction with Christ the King Church in Hesperia.
