Hesperia Building Project Wrapping Up

I've been waiting since June of 2009 to write this article letting district residents know that the construction project is nearing completion. With the exception of some athletic flooring in the middle school gym addition, all of the construction work on the

project has been completed. Contractors are in the process of finishing up their punch lists to correct any areas that need to be addressed before we sign off on the project.

The district is also looking at the possibility of tackling two or three additional remodeling projects with remaining bond dollars. Favorable bids have enabled the project to come in under the amount originally budgeted. As a result, the board is looking at addressing projects that were identified initially and eliminated



due to budget priorities. Projects being considered include: renovation of the existing kitchen and transportation facilities and renovation of or construction of a new restroom facility to accommodate spectators at football, track, baseball and softball events. District representatives are working with Triangle Associates to develop pricing options for the additional projects listed above.

Budgetary information on the projects listed above will be provided to board of education members for their review and approval prior to the conclusion of this school year. Work on these additional projects would be completed this summer, with all work completed prior to the beginning of school in the fall.

Superintendent's Letter

To our Hesperia Community School District Community:

As you are aware, Governor Rick Snyder unveiled his budget proposal for the State, which includes significant cuts for K-12 Education. I wanted to take a moment to let you know what those cuts will mean for the Hesperia Community School District.

The governor is proposing a \$470 per pupil reduction in state aid for local school districts for next year. This is in addition to the substantial cuts in revenue that we have experienced for the past several years. The bottom line is that the Hesperia Community School District will receive approximately \$542,000 less to educate our students in 2011-2012 than we did in 2010-2011

These proposed cuts will be devastating to every school district statewide. It will force many into deficit and will have a significant impact on each school in Michigan.

Because of prudent fiscal planning, the Hesperia Community School district is in a better position than most. Since 2003, we have cut over \$2.2 million from the district's budget and spent nearly \$1.1 million in fund equity that we had set aside for emergencies. At the time of the governor's announcement, we had already planned for a reduction in revenue of \$270 per pupil from the 2010-2011 budget. The governor's proposed budget will require the district to reduce our per pupil revenue by an additional \$200 per student for a total of \$470 for the 2011-2012 budget. Through careful budgeting, up until now, we have been able to keep most cuts away from the classroom, but there is only so much we can cut before there just isn't anywhere to go.

Governor Snyder's proposed reductions will affect every student in the Hesperia Community School District. These reductions will force us to cut programming, staff and other areas that directly affect instruction. The district's administration is in the process of working on the 2011-2012 budget with the intent of factoring in these latest budget cuts from the State.

In closing, these are difficult times and we realize that there are no easy answers. Rest assured, we will continue to put our student's needs first and make every decision with the goal of ensuring that the Hesperia Community School District is able to offer the highest quality education for students for generations to come.

New Immunization Requirements

ATTENTION PARENTS:

NEW CHICKENPOX and ADOLESCENT IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2010

Required for <u>ALL</u> children entering kindergarten, all 6TH grade students and <u>ALL</u> children changing school districts:

Two doses of varicella (Var) vaccine or history of chickenpox disease

Required for <u>ALL</u> children enrolled in 6th grade and for <u>ALL</u> children

11 through 18 years changing school districts:

One dose of meningococcal (MCV4 or MPSV4) vaccine on or after the 11th birthday.

One dose of tetanus/diphtheria/acellular pertussis; (Tdap) on or after the 11th birthday if 5 years since last dose of tetanus/diphtheria vaccine. (DTaP, Td, DT) Two doses of varicella vaccine or history of chickenpox disease

If you have any question regarding the immunization status of your child:

Check with your doctor

Check with the school nurse office regarding what data is reflected in the Michigan immunization data base

A waiver must be on file if required immunizations are declined

News from the High School Principal

Greetings from Hesperia High School

As winter slowly fades and the signs of spring are all around us, our thoughts naturally turn to spring sports, prom, graduation and all of the other wonderful things that come with this time of year. However, I would like to take this opportunity to reflect on some of the very positive things that have happened at Hesperia High School since our last newsletter.

This past winter gave us many opportunities to celebrate the achievements of our students. The wrestling team, under the direction of Doug Baird and Craig Zeerip, once again had an outstanding season. With a squad made up predominantly of underclassmen, the team won its seventh consecutive league title, 16th consecutive District title and their seventh consecutive Regional title. In addition, the wrestlers maintained their status as one of the State's elite programs. Once again they wrestled their way to the State Finals before losing a hard fought match to Hudson to finish as the 2011 State Runner Up. Individually, nine Hesperia Wrestlers earned All-State honors with Cody Wolever winning the State Championship at heavyweight.

Our Science Olympiad team, coached by Jennifer Sherburn, recently competed at its annual competition in Greenville. After many weeks of planning and preparation, the team finished a very respectable seventh in a competitive 15-team field. The team's success was linked to a big increase in participation and enthusiasm as, for the first time ever; the program featured a full 15-member roster. Much like the wrestling program, the future looks bright for our Science Olympiad team, as all but two of its members were underclassmen.

Hesperia High School recently received another bit of exciting news. Among the county schools, our senior class had the highest percentage of students to meet or exceed the ACT College Readiness Standards. In order to be deemed college ready by ACT, a student must receive a minimum score of 18 in English, 21 in Reading, 22 in Math, and 24 in Science.

All of these successes have come about as a result of a great deal of hard work. Our staff and students are to be commended for the time and effort they have invested in making them happen.


